

The Robbins Family consists of six weights ranging from light to black with corresponding italics. The basic skeleton for the design is a simple geometric sans but deviates in some subtle, and sometimes not so subtle ways.

Sharp corners are softly rounded and vertical strokes are drawn with a gentle flowing wave. This undulation gives an impression that there might be a slight spur serif on the upper left and lower right of each stroke.

The lower case forms have wide open counters and are bouncier than their geometric cousins as the elastic wave treatment continues throughout.

In text settings, Robbins is clean and direct with an underlying breezy cheerfulness. Playful idiosyncrasies start to appear in larger display settings.

OPENTYPE FEATURES

STYLISTIC SET 1 STYLISTIC ALTERNATE SET

Swaps out specific default glyphs with stylistic alternates that stay clear of diagonal strokes and instead focus on curved forms.

AMNVWY → AMNUWY
vwY → UWy

STYLISTIC SET 2 SINGLE STORY “a”

Replaces the two story a with a one story alternate. Commonly used with italics.

a → a a → a

STYLISTIC SET 3 REVERSE ALTERNATE “A”

Provides the option to horizontally mirror the alternate A.

PROPORTIONAL FIGURES

These are the default figures. They have varying widths and are kerned to each other and to punctuation.

TABULAR FIGURES

Figures that need to align within tables or cells, all have equal width and no kerning.

Convert default figures to upper or lower vertical positions.

ROBBINS UNYUCKY CREAMED CARROTS



Growing up, there was nothing I despised more on the dinner table than creamed carrots. I liked cream and had nothing against carrots but the combination of the two was flat out hideous to my young palate. When my wife announced one night that we were having creamed carrots with the pork chops, I tried to talk her into making butternut squash instead. She knows I don't like butternut squash. She said not to worry, that I would like her Mom's version and it turned out she was right. Again. We have it quite often now and I have never once tried to sneak it under the table and into my socks like I always did as a kid.

- INGREDIENTS** ♦ Cut up the carrots into one inch
- 5 Large Carrots** ♦ chunks. If any of the small potatoes
 - 10 Small Potatoes** ♦ are large-ish, cut them in half.
 - 3 Tbsp Butter** ♦ Start the carrots and potatoes
 - 3 Tbsp Flour** ♦ boiling. They will be done about the
 - 1½ Cup Whole Milk** ♦ same time that the sauce is ready.
 - ¼ Cup Parsley** ♦ **For the sauce:** melt the butter on
 - ¼ Cup Green Onion** ♦ medium high in a medium sauce
 - ¼ tsp Salt** ♦ pan. Dump in the flour and stir for
 - ¼ tsp Pepper** ♦ three or four minutes. Slowly whisk

in the milk and stir until it is all smooth. Let this simmer for ten minutes. While you are waiting around, chop up the parsley and onion. Then mix these into the sauce with the salt and pepper and let it all simmer for another five minutes, stirring occasionally.

By now the carrots and potatoes should be done. Drain and mix them with the sauce. If it all seems a little too thick, stir in some chicken broth. And it can't hurt to sprinkle on a bit of parmesan cheese if you happen have it laying around!
